### ***Chapter Leader Honored***

When Sharon Douglas' husband died unexpectedly in 2016, she said, like many surviving spouses, she felt lost. But soon after, she received a call from the membership chairman of the Northern Arizona Chapter of MOAA inviting her to attend a chapter meeting.

"I'm not sure why I went, but I did, and everyone was welcoming," Douglas said, whose husband had been a longtime member of national MOAA. "I felt comfortable and liked what they were supporting."

It didn't take long for her to take on a leadership role, becoming treasurer of the chapter. Today, she not only serves as chapter president but also as surviving spouse liaison for the Arizona Council of Chapters – a role that allows her to help other surviving spouses navigate the oftentimes challenging journey following the death of their spouse.

"My biggest responsibility is reaching out to surviving spouses in our chapters in the state, especially the new surviving spouses, and trying to give them some direction about what they need to do," Douglas said.

For her work, Douglas is a recipient of MOAA's 2021 Surviving Spouse Liaison Excellence Award.

"[Sharon]" is extremely intelligent, strong, and motivated," said LtCol Dick Jonas, USAF (Ret), immediate past president of the Arizona Council of Chapters. "She has a good heart, and she is ideally suited to the position of surviving spouse liaison. She demonstrates that capability on a continuing basis – with complete empathy and compassion. She is most deserving of the Surviving Spouse Liaison Excellence Award."

Douglas says the surviving spouse liaison role is important in all MOAA chapters to ensure surviving spouses know they have someone to turn to after losing their significant other.

## **SURVIVING SPOUSE IMPORTANT INFORMATION:**

### MILITARY RETIREE SURVIVOR COMFORT ACT (H.R. 2214)

- The Military retiree Survivor Comfort Act (H.R. 2214) would allow survivors to keep the full amount of the retirement check issued for the final month in which the member was alive without the shock of losing a large chunk of funds from DFAS recoupment. The survivor will instead, gradually repay the amount over the next 12 months and have an opportunity to request debt forgiveness through the Department of Defense.
- SPONSOR: Rep. Garamendi, John [D-CA-3] (Introduced 03/26/2021)
- COMMITTEE: House – Armed Services
- LATEST ACTION: House – 03/26/2021 Referred to the House Committee on Armed Services.
- **Contact your representatives and let them know you support this bill.**

### CARING FOR SURVIVORS ACT (H.R. 3402)

- This bill increases the monthly rate of dependency and Indemnity compensation payable to surviving spouses through the Department of Veterans Affairs.
- The bill also adjusts the amount payable to surviving spouses and children of veterans who were rated as totally disabled for a period of less than 10 years before their death.
- SPONSOR: Rep Hayes, Jahana [D-CT-5] (Introduced 05/20/2021)
- COMMITTEE: House – Veterans Affairs
- LATEST ACTION: House – 10/20/2021 Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs hearings held.




