Then, with redress of grievances spurned: "In Congress, July 4, 1776 - The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen united States of America, When in the Course of human events,…" The Second Continental Congress Declared Independence from Britan and under George Washington, commissioned Commander of all Continental Forces, We, Members of the United States Military, from all Colonies, answered the call to arms and united to throw off the bonds of tyranny and "to provide new Guards for their future security." Thus, ensuring that this nation was free to form a self-governing Confederation and a Constitutional Republic.

My DD-214 says: Subject to Recall by the Secretary of the Navy. On this 4th of July, 2023, I yet stand ready to serve and am proud to be a member of the family known as the Northern Arizona Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America (NACMOAA).

Legislative Affairs Update BY COL (Ret) Steve Woods, U.S. Army

Advocacy Action Items:

Here are the current advocacy action items as taken from the most recent "National MOAA Newsletters":

- <u>Latest COLA Projection Shows Much Smaller Raise for Military Retirees.</u> As inflation cools, so will the annual adjustment to many federal benefits. Here's what you need to know.
- Star Act Focus Turns to Senate: Act Now to Help Support Combat-Injured Veterans. Grassroots advocacy helped this bill move forward in the House, but more work is needed for a final push. This Act would support more than 50,300 combat-injured Veterans by allowing concurrent receipt of vested longevity pay and VA disability. These individuals, often seriously disabled, are subject to an offset where their retirement pay is reduced for every dollar of VA disability received. In some cases, their retirement pay is completely eliminated. The Star Act has cleared the House Armed Services Committee and will be a stand-alone bill on the floor. The Senate will introduce it as an amendment to the NDAA. Currently, both Arizona Senators have co-sponsored the bill, however Arizona Representatives Biggs, Crane, and Schweikart have not. Their support now could mean so much to making this bill a reality for thousands of combat wounded Veterans. (See preformed letters.)
- <u>Military Spouse Employment in the Spotlight at Modern Day Marine Expo.</u> Marine Corps Commandant Gen. David Berger joined the conversation at this year's event. (See pre-formed letter.)
- <u>NDAA Clears House and Senate Committees: What's In and What's Next?</u> Both bills address pay and housing-allowance concerns but the legislative process is far from over.
- <u>DoD Officials Offer Updates to Tenant Bill of Rights, Other Quality of Life</u> <u>Programs.</u> Find out the latest on many MOAA-supported initiatives to improve the health of the all-volunteer force. (See pre-formed letter.)
- <u>House Subcommittee Plan Would Boost Junior Servicemember Pay by 30%</u>. The move would address both retention and recruitment challenges. Here's where it stands on Capitol Hill. (See 2 pre-formed letters.)
- <u>Senate Bill Supports MOAA's Work</u> To <u>Restore Full Basic Allowance for</u> <u>Housing.</u> Ask your lawmakers in both chambers to co-sponsor this bipartisan, bicameral legislation today. (See 2 pre-formed letters)

Navigating the healthcare system and Tricare regulations is difficult. Below is information on how to educate yourself to receive the maximum benefits you have earned.

Getting a New Prescription? Check TRICARE Formulary Search Tool By TRICARE Communications

FALLS CHURCH, Va. – You're at a medical appointment and you're getting a new prescription. Before your provider sends an electronic prescription or gives you a paper prescription, it may be helpful for you and your provider to look up the drug with the TRICARE Formulary Search Tool.

"The TRICARE Formulary Search Tool makes it easy to learn about your prescription," said Melanie Richardson, a pharmacist in the Pharmacy Operations Division at the Defense Health Agency. "You can see if your prescription is covered, where you can fill it, and if your provider needs to request preauthorization. The tool updates in real time, so information is almost always current."

While you can use the tool any time you'd like, using it with your provider can be helpful if your provider wants to prescribe a drug you've never taken before. Here are some tips on how to use the search tool before you get a new prescription.

How To Use the TRICARE Formulary Search Tool:

The TRICARE pharmacy contractor, Express Scripts, hosts the TRICARE Formulary Search Tool. You don't need to log in to your Express Scripts account to use the tool, so you can use it on a computer or smartphone. Just go to <u>www.express-scripts.com/tform</u> to start a search.

For general information about a drug:

Type the drug name and strength in the medication search box. Beneath the search box, choose your sex and age from the dropdown menus. Click "Search" to see information about the drug. (Continued on page 9)

To filter results by drug strength, form, route, or type:

Click the "Advanced medication search" link. Type the drug name and choose your sex and age from the dropdown menus. Click "Next" to see a list of results. Use the dropdown menus at the top to filter the results. Click "Select" next to the drug you'd like to learn more about. **Information You Can Find:** Once you've looked up your drug, you can find detailed information, including: General information about the drug, including what it's used for, possible side effects, FAQs, and an image of the drug The formulary status of the drug Coverage details and limitations

Whether you can fill your prescription at military pharmacies, through home delivery, or at retail network pharmacies

Copayments

Remember, copayments apply if you aren't an active duty service member, as outlined in the TRICARE Pharmacy Program Overview Fact Sheet. Copayments also vary based on where you get your prescription filled and if the drug is generic, brand name, or non-formulary.

Pre-Authorization (or Prior Authorization) and Medical Necessity

Depending on the drug you search for, you may see a link that says, "Coverage rules apply." This often means your provider needs to request pre-authorization or submit proof of medical necessity to Express Scripts. This is often the case for brand-name drugs that have generic equivalents and non-formulary drugs. It can also apply if the drug has age limits. Click "Coverage rules apply" for more information and provider forms.

Other Drug Options

There may be times when you'll want to see if there are drugs similar to the one you need but with lower out-of-pocket costs or different coverage rules. After you look up a drug, click "Other drug options" beneath the drug's name to check for similar drugs. And if the drug is available as both a generic drug and a brand-name drug, you can toggle between "generic" and "brand-name" tabs to compare costs and coverage for each.

Using the TRICARE Formulary Search Tool helps you make the best decisions about filling your prescriptions. Check out TRICARE Pharmacy Program to learn more about your pharmacy benefit. Please feel free to contact me with your questions or concerns.


